ccording to Florida law, milestone inspections are generally required for condominium and cooperative buildings three stories or more that are 25 years old or older and located within three miles of the coast. For buildings further inland, the requirement typically kicks in at the 30-year mark. After the initial inspection, subsequent inspections are usually required every 10 years.

This may involve non-destructive testing methods, like ground-penetrating radar or ultrasonic testing, to assess the condition of structural components and determine the extent of any issues and to confirm that the building is structurally safe and sound.
